DIGEST

Protest of an award made following competitive sealed proposals, claiming resident vendor preference and lowest cost, is denied. TPUSA, Inc. dba Teleperformance USA's (TPUSA) letter of protest is included by reference. [Attachment 1]

AUTHORITY

The Chief Procurement Officer¹ conducted an administrative review pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. §11-35-4210(4). This decision is based on the evidence and applicable law and precedents.

This Request for Proposals was issued by the South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to obtain a Member Contact Center vendor to provide comprehensive customer service to Medicaid applicants and members in the most efficient and cost effective delivery model available.

ANALYSIS

TPUSA's initial issue of protest alleges:

Teleperformance USA is a native South Carolina bidder in accordance with the definitions of South Carolina Consolidated Procurement Code SECTION 11-35-1524. As a resident vendor with over 1,100 people currently working in a local facility located in Columbia, South Carolina, Teleperformance USA asserts Resident Vendor Preference and further asserts that the winning bidder did not meet the Resident Vendor Preference requirement and does not intend to employ its service center fully in the state of South Carolina as specified in the Request for Proposal Section 3.2.7.

This was a Request for Proposals issued in accordance with Section 11-35-1530 of the Code. Section 11-35-1524(F)(5) stipulates:

This section does not apply to an acquisition of motor vehicles as defined in Section 56-15-10 or an acquisition of supplies or services relating to construction. <u>This section does not apply to a procurement conducted pursuant to</u> Section 11-35-1550(2)(a) or (b), <u>Section 11-35-1530</u>, or Article 9, Chapter 35.

(Emphasis added) The resident vendor preference is not available for solicitations issued under Section 11-35-1530, Competitive Sealed Proposals. This issue of protest is denied.

TPUSA's second issue of protest alleges:

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Teleperformance USA, the highest ranked South Carolina resident bidder who presented a plan for 100% of agents employed for the project to be present in Columbia, South Carolina, presented a cost saving to the state in excess of \$9.6M. This is substantially less than the winning bidder. Teleperformance USA presented a 21% cost discount for technically equivalent services and offered a 100% in-state solution.

This issue of protest alleges no violation of the Code. Proposals received were evaluated in accordance with evaluation criteria published on Page 36 of the solicitation. Cost was one of four evaluation criteria. TPUSA alleges no violation of the Code and this issue of protest is denied.²

DECISION

For the reasons stated above, the protest of TPUSA, Inc. dba Teleperformance USA is denied.

Basis of Protest:

- BOP #1 SECTION 11-35-1524. Resident vendor preference.
 - Teleperformance USA is a native South Carolina bidder in accordance with the definitions of South Carolina Consolidated Procurement Code SECTION 11-35-1524. As a resident vendor with over 1,100 people currently working in a local facility located in Columbia, South Carolina, Teleperformance USA asserts Resident Vendor Preference and further asserts that the winning bidder did not meet the Resident Vendor Preference requirement and does not intend to employ its service center fully in the state of South Carolina as specified in the Request for Proposal Section 3.2.7.
 - Evidence Intent to Award Posting Date: November 17, 2016
- I. In order to obtain a cost savings, SCDHHS agrees to allow no more than forty percent (40%) of the call center staff to be housed outside of the State of South Carolina at Henderson, North Carolina. The total value of the cost savings is: \$1,046,234.00. STATEMENT OF RIGHT TO FURTHER ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

Protest Appeal Notice (Revised November 2016)

The South Carolina Procurement Code, in Section 11-35-4210, subsection 6, states:

(6) Finality of Decision. A decision pursuant to subsection (4) is final and conclusive, unless fraudulent or unless a person adversely affected by the decision requests a further administrative review by the Procurement Review Panel pursuant to Section 11-35-4410(1) within ten days of posting of the decision in accordance with subsection (5). The request for review must be directed to the appropriate chief procurement officer, who shall forward the request to the panel or to the Procurement Review Panel, and must be in writing, setting forth the reasons for disagreement with the decision of the appropriate chief procurement officer. The person also may request a hearing before the Procurement Review Panel. The appropriate chief procurement officer and an affected governmental body shall have the opportunity to participate fully in a later review or appeal, administrative or judicial.

FILE BY CLOSE OF BUSINESS: Appeals must be filed by 5:00 PM, the close of business. *Protest* of *Palmetto Unilect, LLC*, Case No. 2004-6 (dismissing as untimely an appeal emailed prior to 5:00 PM but not received until after 5:00 PM); *Appeal of Pee Dee Regional Transportation Services, et al.*, Case No. 2007-1 (dismissing as untimely an appeal faxed to the CPO at 6:59 PM).

FILING FEE: Pursuant to Proviso 111.1 of the 2016 General Appropriations Act, "[r]equests for administrative review before the South Carolina Procurement Review Panel shall be accompanied by a filing fee of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), payable to the SC Procurement Review Panel. The panel is authorized to charge the party requesting an administrative review under the South 11-35-4210(6), 11-35-4220(5), Carolina Code Sections 11-35-4230(6) and/or 11-35-4410...Withdrawal of an appeal will result in the filing fee being forfeited to the panel. If a party desiring to file an appeal is unable to pay the filing fee because of financial hardship, the party shall submit a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the same time the request for review is filed. The Request for Filing Fee Waiver form is attached to this Decision. If the filing fee is not waived, the party must pay the filing fee within fifteen days of the date of receipt of the order denying waiver of the filing fee. Requests for administrative review will not be accepted unless accompanied by the filing fee or a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the time of filing." Panel Nov. 6, 2002) and *Protest of The Kardon Corporation*, Case No. 2002-13 (Proc. Rev. Panel Jan. 31, 2003); and *Protest of PC&C Enterprises, LLC*, Case No. 2012-1 (Proc. Rev. Panel April 2, 2012). However, individuals and those operating as an individual doing business under a trade name may proceed without counsel, if desired.
