AUTHORITY

The Chief Procurement Officer for Construction (CPOC) conducted an administrative review per S.C. Code Ann. §11-35-4210(4). This decision is based on materials in the procurement file, the stated position of the South Carolina Contractor's Licensing Board, and applicable law and precedents.

BACKGROUND

On September 9, 2019, South Carolina Department of Administration, Division of Facility Management and Property Services (FM) advertised for bids to construct a new Forensics Laboratory Building (the Project) for the South Carolina State Law Enforcement Division (SLED). [Exhibit B] The solicitation documents required bidders to list the subcontractor they intended to use to perform the work of the project under the General Contractor – Specialty license subclassification of Structural Framing (SF). [Exhibit C] Prime bidders were allowed to list themselves for this work provided their contractor's license or combination of licenses permitted them to perform the work of SF.

By the deadline for submitting bids, FM received five bids. [Exhibit D] The lowest bidder, Contract Construction, Inc. (CCI), listed itself for the SF work. [Exhibit E] However, FM determined that all bids exceeded available funds and entered into negotiations with CCI per S.C. Code Ann. § 11-35-3020(d)(i). CCI's bid was for \$52,727,000. FM successfully negotiated CCI's price down to \$48,962,270 and, on December 12, 2019, posted a Notice of Intent to

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Award a Contract to CCI. [Exhibit F] Cleveland Construction, Inc. (Cleveland) protested alleging that CCI's licenses did not allow it to offer to perform SF work on the project, that CCI did not possess the structural credentials required by the project specifications, that CCI's bid did not exceed available funds, and that FM did not make the written determination required by S.C. Code Ann. § 11-35-3020(d)(i) before entering into negotiations.

DISCUSSION

LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATIONS

Cleveland's first two allegations are allegations of nonresponsibility. A determination of responsibility is required by S.C. Code Ann. § 11-35-1810, which states "[r]esponsibility of the bidder or offeror shall be ascertained for each contract let by the State ... " A procurement officer's determination of responsibility is final and conclusive unless it is "clearly erroneous, arbitrary, capricious, or contrary to law." See S.C. Code Ann. § 11-35-2410(A). The protestant has the burden of proving that the procurement officer's determination is "clearly erroneous, arbitrary, capricious, or contrary to law." Protest of Brantley Construction Co., Inc., Panel Case No. 1999-3. In other words, FM's determination about responsibility is a matter of discretion that cannot be overturned absent a showing by Cleveland that it is "clearly erroneous, arbitrary, capricious, or contrary to law." See Protest of CollegeSource, Inc., Panel Case No. 2008-4. Since agency decisions about responsibility are a matter of business judgment, Cleveland must demonstrate a lack of reasonable or rational basis for the responsibility determination. See Protest of Value Options, Panel Case No. 2001-7.

Responsibility is the ability, in all material aspects, to perform the contract. The Contractors Licensing Act requires a contractor to possess the proper license at the time of bidding. SC Code Ann§ 40-11-30. Possession of the proper contractor license, either by the bidder or one of the bidder's listed subcontractors. is an issue of responsibility. *Protest of Burkwood Construction Company. Inc.*, Panel Case No. 1997-8; *Protest of Roofco, Inc.*, Panel Case No. 2000-14(1). If, at the time of bidding, CCI lacked the proper license for performing the SF work on this project then CCI is not a responsible bidder. ¹

At the time of bidding, CCI possessed a General Contractor's license with the classifications of Building (BD), Grading, and Concrete. [Exhibit G]. At issue here is whether the BD classification permits CCI to perform the SF work on the Project. Section 40-11-410 of the Contractor's Licensing Act states:

The following license classifications are in effect:

(1) "General Contractors-Building" which includes commercial, industrial, institutional, modular, and all other types of building construction, including residential structures. This license classification includes all work under the

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subclassifications of Wood Frame Structures-Class II, Interior Renovation, Masonry, Pre-engineered Metal Buildings, General Roofing, and Structural Shapes.

Licensees under this classification may perform ancillary work, including grading, associated with the building or structure which the licensee has been engaged to construct. However, if a project includes work performed under a Mechanical Contractor subclassification or any of these license subclassifications, the licensee must have a license for this work or use a contractor licensed in the appropriate license classification or subclassification to perform the work: Swimming Pools, Bridges, Boring and Tunneling, Water and Sewer Lines, Pipe Lines, Railroad Lines, Specialty Roofing, Marine, Water and Sewer Plants, and Asphalt Paving.

BD expressly includes the General Contractors – Specialty subclassifications of Wood Frame Structures-Class II, Interior Renovation, Masonry, Pre-engineered Metal Buildings, General Roofing, and Structural Shapes but not SF. However, this Section also allows the performance of ancillary work unless this Section expressly excludes the work. This Section does not expressly exclude SF from the type of ancillary work a contractor with a BD classification can perform.

Under the Contractor's Licensing Act, what is ancillary work in a building construction project? This is a question that the Contractor's Licensing Board (Board), the entity charged with administration and enforcement of the Contractor's Licensing Act, has answered. S.C. Code Ann. §§ 40-1-10 et seq. and 40-11-5 et seq. At its January 21, 2016 meeting the Board determined that SF work was ancillary work provided it was not 41% or more of the total cost of construction. [Exhibit H] FM relied on this determination when considering CCI's responsibility. Moreover, FM had a rational basis to rely on the interpretation of the body charged by law with administrating and enforcing the contractor's licensing laws.

Cleveland further alleges that an email from the Project Architect to Cleveland clarified that bidders were to list the Fabricator described in Section 051200(C) as the subcontractor that would perform the SF work. The CPOC does not agree. Neither Cleveland's email to the Architect nor the Architect's response use the word "Fabricator" at all. Cleveland asked:

Bid form, Section 7 listing of Proposed Subcontractors: For Structural Framing, are we to list **structural steel contractor** or Cold Formed Metal Framing contractor?

The Project architect responded: "Structural Steel Contractor." The CPOC also notes that this email is not a part of the solicitation documents. The Instructions to bidders make it clear that bidders are only to rely on official solicitation documents. A review of the subcontractor listing portion of the bid form and accompanying instructions (all of which are a part of the official solicitation documents) makes it clear that bidders were to identify the entity that would perform the work requiring an SF license. Section 40-11-410(4)(j) states that SF includes:

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[T]he installation, repair, or alteration of metal or composite structural members for buildings or structures, including riveting, welding, and rigging. This subclassification also includes work under the subclassification of Structural Shapes.

SF does not include Fabrication.

Cleveland also argues that by listing itself as the SF, CCI failed to comply with the contractual, sub contractual, and sub-sub contractual relationships dictated by Section 051200(C) of the specifications. Cleveland essentially argues that the specifications require the Fabricator to subcontract the erector (i.e. the entity with an SF license) but instead, CCI, as the erector is subcontracting the Fabricator. In this regards, Section 051200(C)(1) states:

1. Fabricator Responsibility

- a. The structural steel fabricator shall be responsible for enlisting the Steel Joist fabricator as a direct subcontractor.
- b. The structural steel fabricator shall be responsible for enlisting the Steel Deck fabricator for steel deck bearing on structural steel or steel joists as a direct subcontractor
- c. The structural steel fabricator shall be responsible for enlisting the steel erector as a direct subcontractor.
- d. The structural steel fabricator shall be responsible for enlisting the steel joist erector as a direct subcontractor.
- e. The structural steel fabricator shall be responsible for enlisting the steel deck erector for steel bearing on structural steel or steel joists as a direct subcontractor.

A bidder's bid must conform "in all material aspects to the invitation for bids." S.C. Code Ann, § 11-35-1410(9). However, the procurement officer may waive a minor informality or irregularity that is "a matter of form or is some immaterial variation from the exact requirements of the invitation for bids having no effect or merely a trivial or negligible effect total bid price, quality, quantity, or delivery... or performance of the contract, and the ... waiver of which would not be prejudicial to bidders." S.C. Code Ann. § 11-35-1520(13). A literal reading of the Fabricator Responsibilities precludes the Fabricator from self-performing steel erection even if the Fabricator possess an SF license subclassification. This is nonsense. The CPOC finds it to be immaterial whether the steel erection is performed by the prime contractor, a sub-contractor to the prime contractor (i.e. the Fabricator), or a sub-subcontractor to the prime contractor as long as the prime contractor and its subcontractors adhere to the Contractor's Licensing Act.

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Cleveland alleges that even if CCI's license allows it to perform the SF work, CCI "lacks the requisite certifications for steel fabrication as required by the Specifications for the Project." Specification Section 051200(C) states:

C. Fabricator Qualifications: A qualified fabricator that participates in the AISC Quality Certification Program and is designated an AISC-Certified Plant, Category BU (Certified Building Fabricator) and which employs personnel or an independent testing agency that are qualified to complete all the required inspections and testing. Personnel shall be qualified as required by A WS D 1.1 where completing weld testing and inspection.

As previously noted, the work of SF does not include fabrication; therefore, CCI does not need to have the required Fabricator qualifications to list itself for the SF work.

NEGOTIATION PER S.C. CODE ANN. § 11-35-3020(d)(i)

Section 11-35-3020(d)(i) states:

If bids received pursuant to an invitation for bids exceed available funds, and it is determined in writing by the governmental body that circumstances do not permit the delay required to resolicit competitive sealed bids, and the base bid, less deductive alternates, does not exceed available funds by an amount greater than ten percent of the construction budget established for that portion of the work, a contract may be negotiated pursuant to this section with the lowest responsible and responsive bidder. The governmental body may change the scope of the work to reduce the price to be within the established construction budget but may not reduce the price below the established construction budget more than ten percent without a written request by the agency and the written approval of the chief procurement officer based on the interest of the State.

Cleveland argues that the lowest bid did not exceed available and, therefore, FM could not take advantage of negotiations. In support of its contention, Cleveland relies on SLED's budget request for the project submitted in FY 2017/2018. [Exhibit I to Cleveland's Protest] In that document, SLED requests \$54,078,993 for construction costs. That document also states - "Soft Costs Paid by SLED - \$3,520,307." The document does not spell out what is included in soft costs. The CPOC observes that this budget request is just that; it is not a final document that defines the budget available for this project. Budget Proviso 112.1 of the 2018-2019 Appropriation Act appropriates \$54,078,993 to the Project. The Proviso does not mention any other funds. Moreover, the State Fiscal Accountability Authority approved Permanent Improvement Project Form A-1 states that the entire budget for the Project is \$54,078,993. [Exhibit I] All Architect/Engineer Fees, construction and contingencies are to be paid out of this amount. Because the Form A-1 did not include any other funds, SLED cannot expend any other funds on this project. Additionally, the Office of State Engineer (OSE) requires agencies to submit a budget of construction cost before soliciting bids on the second page of the OSE Form

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310. The Form in this case estimates construction cost at \$48,897,476 and states that the "Construction Budget for this Contract" is \$49,902,970. [Exhibit J]

CCI bid \$52,727,000. Deducting Professional Services Fees, inspection costs, and contingency from \$54,078,993 results in an amount less than \$50 million in available funds. In other words, the evidence shows that all bids exceeded available funds.

Finally, Cleveland argues that there is no evidence that FM or SLED made a written determination that "circumstances did not permit the delay required to resolicit competitive sealed bids" before engaging in negotiations. FM provided the CPOC a copy of a written determination in response to this protest. The determination is not dated, and one cannot tell from the document whether the determination was prepared in advance of negotiations. However, even if FM prepared the document after negotiations, Cleveland is not prejudiced. This is a minor technicality which FM cured. *See Appeal by Value Options*, Panel Case No. 2001-7; *Protest by Gregory Electric*, Panel Case No. 1989-17C (civil action no. 90-CP-40-0348). To hold otherwise would result in remanding this matter to FM to renegotiate what has already been negotiated in order to make sure negotiations occur after the written determination is prepared. This is an absurd result and one that will not result in any practical change.

DECISION

Based on the foregoing, the CPOC finds that 1) FM reasonably relied on the Board's interpretation of the contractor's licensing laws in determining that CCI was a responsible bidder and FM's determination was not "clearly erroneous, arbitrary, capricious, or contrary to law"; 2) to the extent the bid documents purport to require the Fabricator to subcontract steel erection, CCI's decision to self-perform steel erection is an immaterial variation from the requirements of the invitation for bid; 3) the invitation for bids does not require the steel erector to possess AISC certification; and 4) though the written determination to enter into negotiations may have been written after the fact, this minor technicality which FM has curred. Accordingly, the protest is denied.

Protest Appeal Notice (Revised June 2019)

The South Carolina Procurement Code, in Section 11-35-4210, subsection 6, states:

(6) Finality of Decision. A decision pursuant to subsection (4) is final and conclusive, unless fraudulent or unless a person adversely affected by the decision requests a further administrative review by the Procurement Review Panel pursuant to Section 11-35-4410(1) within ten days of posting of the decision in accordance with subsection (5). The request for review must be directed to the appropriate chief procurement officer, who shall forward the request to the panel or to the Procurement Review Panel, and must be in writing, setting forth the reasons for disagreement with the decision of the appropriate chief procurement officer. The person also may request a hearing before the Procurement Review Panel. The appropriate chief procurement officer and an affected governmental body shall have the opportunity to participate fully in a later review or appeal, administrative or judicial.

If a party desiring to file an appeal is unable to pay the filing fee because of financial hardship, the party shall submit a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the same time the request for review is filed. [The Request for Filing Fee Waiver form is attached to this Decision.] If the filing fee is not waived, the party must pay the filing fee within fifteen days of the date of receipt of the order denying waiver of the filing fee. Requests for administrative review will not be accepted unless accompanied by the filing fee or a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the time of filing." PLEASE MAKE YOUR CHECK PAYABLE TO THE "SC PROCUREMENT REVIEW PANEL."

LEGAL REPRESENTATION: In order to prosecute an appeal before the Panel, business entities organized and registered as corporations, limited liability companies, and limited partnerships must be represented by a lawyer. Failure to obtain counsel will result in dismissal of your appeal. *Protest of Lighting Services*, Case No. 2002-10 (Proc. Rev. Panel Nov. 6, 2002) and *Protest of The Kardon Corporation*, Case No. 2002-13 (Proc. Rev. Panel Jan. 31, 2003); and *Protest of PC&C Enterprises*, *LLC*, Case No. 2012-1 (Proc. Rev. Panel April 2, 2012). However, individuals and those operating as an individual doing business under a trade name may proceed without counsel, if desired.

Protest of Notice of Intent to Award

Dear Chief Procurement Officer:

Pursuant to S.C. Code § 11-35-4210, Cleveland Construction, Inc. ("Cleveland") hereby protests the Notice of Intent to Award to Contract Construction, Inc. ("Contract") posted on December 12, 2019 for Project No. D50-9976-CB, the New SLED Forensics Laboratory Building located in Columbia, SC (the "Project"). Cleveland has standing under S.C. Code § 11-35-4210(1)(b) to bring this protest because it was an actual bidder for the Project and has been aggrieved in connection with the intended award to Contract. As set forth in further detail below, the Notice of Intent to Award to Contract is improper and should be rescinded for two independent reasons: (1) Contract is not a responsible bidder because it lacks the requisite licensure and certifications; and (2) the Agency improperly negotiated with Contract subsequent to opening of the bids submitted for the Project.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

The Department of Administration, Division of Facility Management and Property Services (the "Agency") issued a solicitation for competitive sealed bids for the Project on September 9, 2019 (see Exhibit A, Invitation for Design-Bid-Build Construction Services). Pursuant to the requirements of S.C. Code § 11-35-3020(b)(i), the solicitation required each bidder to list on its bid form the licensed subcontractor it intended to use on the Project for, among others, the subcontractor specialty of "Structural Framing," license subclassification abbreviation "SF" (see Exhibit B, Lump Sum Bid Form). The Instructions for Subcontractor Listing provided in the Bid Form specifically state that:

¹ Cleveland was a responsive and responsible bidder and was the third-lowest bidder for the Project. Like Contract, the second-lowest bidder, Edcon, Inc., also was not a responsible bidder because the subcontractor it listed on its bid form for Structural Framing (Macuch Steel) did not have the requisite licensure at the time of the bid.

Bidder must only list subcontractors who possess a South Carolina contractor's license that includes the license classification and/or subclassification identified by the Owner in Columns A & B. The subcontractor license must also be within the appropriate license group for the work. If Bidder lists a subcontractor who is not qualified to perform the work, the Bidder will be rejected as non-responsible.

The Instructions for Subcontractor Listing further clarify that a Bidder may list itself, but only if "under the terms of the Bidding Documents and SC Contractor Licensing laws, Bidder is qualified to perform the work of a listed subcontractor classification or subclassification."

The bids for the Project were opened on October 24, 2019. Five contractors submitted bids for the Project, including Cleveland and Contract. Contract submitted a base bid of \$52,727,000 and was the apparent low bidder; it listed itself as the Structural Framing subcontractor on its bid form (see Exhibit C, Bid Tabulation). On December 12, 2019, the Agency posted a Notice of Intent to Award the contract for the Project to Contract (see Exhibit D, Notice of Intent to Award). The Notice of Intent to Award was for \$48,962,270, which is \$3,764,730 less than Contract's base bid for the Project. No alternates were accepted. In the "Remarks" section of the Notice of Intent to Award, the Agency stated that "we negotited [sic] down to the new amount of \$48,962,270 to get in budget." Cleveland gave notice of its intent to protest the Notice of Intent to Award on December 17, 2019.

DISCUSSION

1. Contract is Not a Responsible Bidder Because It Lacks the Requisite Licensure and Certifications

The South Carolina Procurement Code requires that an award only be made to a "responsible" bidder. S.C. Code § 11-35-3020(2)(c); see also § 11-35-1810. "Possession of the proper contractor's license, either by the bidder or one of the bidder's listed subcontractors, is an issue of responsibility." Protest of Newtech, Inc., File No. 2016-2; citing Protest of Brantley Construction Co., Case No. 1999-3. "If, at the time of bidding, a subcontractor listed on a bidder's bid does not possess the proper license for performing the work for which the subcontractor was listed, then neither the listed subcontractor nor the bidder are responsible." Protest of Newtech, Inc., citing S.C. Code § 40-11-200(B) and Protest of Burkwood Construction Co, Inc., Case No. 1997-8. A governmental body does not have any discretion in the matter; if the contractor or one of its listed subcontractors lacks the proper license, the bidder is "always" non-responsible, and the governmental body cannot accept the bid. Protest of Roofco, Inc., Case No. 2000-14(I) ("the lack of a proper license to do the work solicited in a state contract will always render a bidder nonresponsible") (emphasis added).

Contract is not a responsible bidder because it listed itself as performing the Structural Framing subcontractor specialty, but it does not have the requisite licensure for Structural Framing. As set forth above, the solicitation for the Project requires the contractor performing the Structural Framing to possess a South Carolina contractor's license with the license subclassification "SF." At the time of the bid, Contract possessed four South Carolina contractor's licenses (*see* Exhibit E, abstracts of Contract's South Carolina contractor's licenses). None of Contract's four licenses includes the SF classification. Because Contract's licenses do not include the appropriate Structural Framing subclassification, Contract does not have the proper license and therefore is not a responsible bidder.

When Cleveland presented this information to the Agency's Project Coordinator, Saied Darvish, Mr. Darvish suggested that the "General Contractors-Building" license classification includes the Structural Framing Subclassification, and that because Contract maintains a license with the General Contractors-Building classification, it therefore has the requisite licensure. This is incorrect and contradicts a plain reading of the South Carolina Contractor's Licensing Act. The Act sets forth two separate classifications for General Contractors-Building and General Contractors-Specialty. The Act further sets forth each of the various subclassifications that are included within each of those classifications. The General Contractors-Specialty classification includes both the "Structural Shapes" and the "Structural Framing" subclassifications. S.C. Code § 40-11-410(4). The General Contractors-Building classification, in contrast, includes only the Structural Shapes subclassification and does <u>not</u> list the Structural Framing subclassification. S.C. Code § 40-11-410(1).

The Act further clarifies that Structural Shapes and Structural Framing are two separate and distinct subclassifications. The Structural Shapes subclassification is defined as "the installation, repair, or alteration of metal or composite shapes, tubing, pipes and bars, including minor field fabrication as may be necessary." S.C. Code § 40-11-410(4)(k). The Structural Framing subclassification is more expansive; it is defined as "the installation, repair, or alteration or metal or composite structural members for buildings or structures, including riveting, welding, and rigging," and it "includes work under the subclassification of Structural Shapes." S.C. Code § 40-11-410(4)(j). In other words, the Structural Framing subclassification includes Structural Shapes, but the Structural Shapes subclassification does not include Structural Framing. Accordingly, a plain reading of the statute demonstrates that the General Contractors-Specialty license classification includes the Structural Framing subclassification, but the General Contractors-Building license classification does not. Because Contract only maintains a General Contractors-Building license classification, it does not have the requisite licensure for Structural Framing, and it is not a responsible bidder.

Even if Contract did have the requisite licensure for Structural Framing (which it does not), Contract still is not a responsible bidder for the additional reason that it lacks the requisite certifications for steel fabrication as required by the Specifications for the Project. During the prebid process, the Architect clarified that the "Structural Framing" subcontractor that was to be listed on the bid form was the "Structural Steel Contractor" (see Exhibit F, 10/14/19 email from D. Anderson to P. Alexander). The bid set Specifications for the Project require the Structural Steel Fabricator to be AISC-certified (see Exhibit G – Bid Set Specifications Section 051200(C)). Contract is not AISC-certified (see Exhibit H – Search results for AISC members). The bid set specifications also require the Structural Steel Fabricator to enlist the steel erector as a direct subcontractor (see Exhibit G – Bid Set Specifications Section 051200 (C)(1)(c)). However, it appears that Contract's intent is to perform steel erection itself and subcontract out the Steel Fabrication to an unknown third-party, which is inconsistent with the requirements of the Bid Set Specifications. For these additional reasons, Contract is not a responsible bidder.

2. The Agency Improperly Negotiated With Contract Subsequent to Opening the Bids

When a construction procurement is subject to competitive sealed bidding, the Procurement Code requires that the project be awarded to the "lowest responsive and responsible bidder whose bid meets the requirements set forth in the invitation for bids." S.C. Code § 11-35-3020(c)(i). A governmental body may not negotiate with bidders unless all bids received in response to the invitation for bids "exceed available funds." S.C. Code § 11-35-3020(d)(i). If all bids exceed

available funds, the governmental body may negotiate with the "lowest responsible and responsive bidder," but only if "it is determined in writing by the governmental body that circumstances do not permit the delay required to resolicit competitive sealed bids." *Id*.

The Agency was not permitted to negotiate with Contract because, as set forth in Section 1 above, Contract was not the lowest responsible and responsive bidder. But even if Contract were the lowest responsible and responsive bidder (and it is not), the Agency still was not permitted to negotiate with Contract because Contract's bid does not appear to "exceed available funds." Upon information and belief, the Agency's budget for the construction costs for the Project was \$54,078,993. The 2018-2019 Appropriation Act, for instance, authorized the transfer of \$54,078,993 from debt service to the Agency for the Project. See 2018-2019 Appropriation Act, Part IB, Section 112.1. The Agency's capital request for the Project clarifies that the \$54,078,993 allocated for the Project is for "Construction Costs" only; its budget includes an additional \$3,520,307 for "Soft Costs" (such as design and consulting services) for a total budget of \$57,599,300 for the Project. See Exhibit I — Capital Request Form. Contract's base bid of \$52,727,000 was below the Agency's \$54,078,993 budget for construction costs for the Project, and the Agency therefore was not permitted to negotiate with Contract.

Moreover, even if Contract were the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, and even if Contract's bid did exceed available funds, it is not clear that the Agency made the required written determination that circumstances do not permit the delay required to resolicit competitive sealed bids. The Notice of Intent to Award merely states that the Agency "negotited [sic] down . . . to get in budget." Nowhere on the Notice does the Agency make any written determination that circumstances do not permit a delay to resolicit bids. Without making such a written determination, the Agency may not engage in negotiations.

For each of the independent reasons set forth above, and the Notice of Intent to Award the contract for the Project to Contract was improper and should be rescinded.





The Forensics Lab consists of three divisions – Forensic Investigative Support, Forensic Administration and Forensic Operations. These divisions are further broken down into 13 sections –Administration, Lab Support, Latent Prints/Photography, Forensic Technology, Computer Crimes, Crime Scene, Firearms/Toolmarks, Quality/Safety and Evidence Control, DNA Section, Drug Analysis, Implied Consent, Trace Evidence/Questioned Documents, and Toxicology.

The SLED Laboratory provides forensic support to all city, county, state, and federal agencies in all 46 counties. In FY16-17, SLED Forensics assisted 292 different agencies state wide. The current forensic building, dedicated in 1990, has some logistical constraints impacting evidence flow and discipline specific objectives that can no longer be addressed adequately through renovations and modifications to the current structure.
