This matter is before the Chief Procurement Officer (CPO) pursuant to two protests filed against the same procurement by Thompson & Little, Inc. (Thompson & Little) under authority of South Carolina Code Section 11-35-4210. With this invitation for bids (IFB), the South Carolina Department of Corrections (SCDC) attempts to procure kitchen equipment. After evaluating the bids received, on May 29, 2014 SCDC posted its intent to award to C.E. Holt Refrigeration, Inc. (Holt) On June 2, 2014, Thompson & Little protested SCDC's intent to award Item #1, 14 convection ovens to Holt. On June 5, 2014, Thompson & Little protested SCDC's intent to award Item #3, 12 tilting gas skillets to Holt. Regarding its protest of the award for Item #1, Thompson & Little alleged, "The basis of the Intent to Award to CE Holt is a spark ignition, rather than a hot surface igniter." Regarding its protest of the award for Item #3, Thompson & Little alleged, "I have reviewed the specs for the item and have also been told by both manufacturer's Cleveland, and Southbend, for which I bid the spec and an alternate, that manual hand tilt is what was requested. CE Holt bid a power tilt model."

As the issues to be decided are clear, the CPO makes this decision without benefit of a hearing, based upon an administrative review of the protest letter [Ex. 1]; the response to the protest from Ruthie Bishop, SCDC Procurement Director [Ex. 2]; and the procurement file.

NATURE OF PROTEST

The letter of protest and the response by Ms. Bishop are attached and incorporated herein by reference

FINDINGS OF FACT

The following dates are relevant to the protest:

1. On March 26, 2014, SCDC published the IFB. [Ex. 3]
2. On April 10, 2014, SCDC issued Amendment #1. [Ex. 4]
3. On April 21, 2014, SCDC opened the bids.
4. On May 29, 2014, SCDC posted its Intent to Award. [Ex. 5]
5. On June 2, 2014, Thompson & Little submitted its protest of Item #1.
6. On June 5, 2014, Thompson & Little submitted its protest of Item #3.

DISCUSSION

According to the Tendering Text, of the Bidding Schedule, SCDC required for the protested items:

Item #1 - Hobart Convection Oven Model HGC502 Natural set of 2 stacked with exhaust kit-110v-10 phase. Relevant to the protest, SCDC required "Electronic Spark Ignition." [(Ex. 3, p. 21)]

Item #3 - Tilting Skillet, Gas: Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 gallon - 110V-10 phase. Relevant to the protest, SCDC required "HTS Manual hand tilt (hydraulic)" and "Power Tilt (Hydraulic Hand Tilt Optional)." [Ex. 3, p. 23]

In Amendment 1, SCDC amended the specifications to allow bidders to offer products equal to the products specified. It read, "SCDC will accept an equal for all food service equipment, items 1-12."

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Regarding award of an invitation for bids, the Consolidated Procurement Code reads, "notice of an award or an intended award of a contract [must be given] to the lowest responsive

and responsible bidders whose bid meets the requirements set forth in the invitation for bids.” [11-35-1520(10) Award] The Code defines a responsive bidder as “a person who has submitted a bid or offer which conforms in all material aspects to the invitation for bids or request for proposals.” [11-35-1410(7)]

Item 1 - Hobart Convection Oven Model HGC502 Natural set of 2 stacked with exhaust kit-110v-10 phase. (Or equal) Relevant to the protest, SCDC required “Electronic Spark Ignition.” [(Ex. 3, p. 21)]

The IFB required bidders to offer bids for convection ovens with electronic spark ignition. Initially, SCDC evaluated Thompson & Little’s bid and determined it not responsive to this requirement. However, in a June 9, 2014 response to the protest, Ms. Bishop wrote, “Thompson & Little, Inc., submitted Southbend Convection Model SL-Series (SLGS/22SC).” Following evaluation SCDC rejected Thompson & Little’s bid as nonresponsive due to the electronic spark ignition requirement. According to Ms. Bishop, “The next (low) vendor was C.E. Holt. C.E. Holt submitted a Southbend B-Series Model: BGS/22SC.” She wrote further, “Based on additional information received after the protest was filed from Brian Jurasek, VP of Sales-Southeast Southbend, the hot surface igniter system is used in both the BGS and the SLGS convection ovens. This system uses a 24v, silicon carbide, hot surface igniter that lights the burner system for both series. Please do not confuse this with an electronic spark igniter, which is a system that Southbend does not use on any of its convection ovens.”

Ms. Bishop concluded, “Based on the new information obtained from Brian Jurasek, SCDC is making a motion to the Chief Procurement Officer of South Carolina to rescind the award that SCDC made to C.E. Holt.”

With new evidence that neither the bids for convection ovens offered by Thompson & Little nor CE Holt were responsive to SCDC’s requirement for spark ignition, the CPO concurs. The protest of Item #1 is granted.

Item #3 - Tilting Skillet, Gas: Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 gallon - 110V-10 phase. Relevant to the protest, SCDC required “HTS Manual hand tilt (hydraulic)” and “Power Tilt (Hydraulic Hand Tilt Optional).” [Ex. 3, p. 23]

The IFB required bidders to offer bids for a tilting skillet range with both manual hand tilt and power tilt citing Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 gallon -110V-10 phase as the standard model. SCDC evaluated the bids received and posted its award to CE Holt.

However, Ms. Bishop wrote June 9, 2014, in SCDC’s response to the protest, “Based on additional information received after the protest was filed from Mark Schantz with Cleveland Range SCDC specifications are inadequate or ambiguous because Tilting Skillet, Gas: Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 Gallon-110V-10 phase is not available with both a manual tilt and a power tilt. Therefore, SCDC Division of Food Services must determine their need and resubmit a clear and accurate set of specifications to SCDC Procurement Department in order to rebid the item. Therefore, based on the new information obtained from Mark Schantz at Cleveland Range SCDC is making a motion to the Chief Procurement Officer of South Carolina to rescind the award that SCDC made to C.E. Holt for line item 3.”

Based on the submittal from Ms. Bishop that “SCDC specifications are inadequate or ambiguous because the Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 Gallon-110V-10 phase specified is not available with both a manual tilt and a power tilt”, as required by the specifications, the award of Item #3 to Holt has been cancelled by separate determination. Therefore, the protest is dismissed as moot.

STATEMENT OF RIGHT TO FURTHER ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW
Protest Appeal Notice (Revised June 2013)

The South Carolina Procurement Code, in Section 11-35-4210, subsection 6, states:

(6) Finality of Decision. A decision pursuant to subsection (4) is final and conclusive, unless fraudulent or unless a person adversely affected by the decision requests a further administrative review by the Procurement Review Panel pursuant to Section 11-35-4410(1) within ten days of posting of the decision in accordance with subsection (5). The request for review must be directed to the appropriate chief procurement officer, who shall forward the request to the panel or to the Procurement Review Panel, and must be in writing, setting forth the reasons for disagreement with the decision of the appropriate chief procurement officer. The person also may request a hearing before the Procurement Review Panel. The appropriate chief procurement officer and an affected governmental body shall have the opportunity to participate fully in a later review or appeal, administrative or judicial.

FILE BY CLOSE OF BUSINESS: Appeals must be filed by 5:00 PM, the close of business. *Protest of Palmetto Unilect, LLC*, Case No. 2004-6 (dismissing as untimely an appeal emailed prior to 5:00 PM but not received until after 5:00 PM); *Appeal of Pee Dee Regional Transportation Services, et al.*, Case No. 2007-1 (dismissing as untimely an appeal faxed to the CPO at 6:59 PM).

FILING FEE: Pursuant to Proviso 108.1 of the 2013 General Appropriations Act, "[r]equests for administrative review before the South Carolina Procurement Review Panel shall be accompanied by a filing fee of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), payable to the SC Procurement Review Panel. The panel is authorized to charge the party requesting an administrative review under the South Carolina Code Sections 11-35-4210(6), 11-35-4220(5), 11-35-4230(6) and/or 11-35-4410...Withdrawal of an appeal will result in the filing fee being forfeited to the panel. If a party desiring to file an appeal is unable to pay the filing fee because of financial hardship, the party shall submit a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the same time the request for review is filed. The Request for Filing Fee Waiver form is attached to this Decision. If the filing fee is not waived, the party must pay the filing fee within fifteen days of the date of receipt of the order denying waiver of the filing fee. Requests for administrative review will not be accepted unless accompanied by the filing fee or a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the time of filing." PLEASE MAKE YOUR CHECK PAYABLE TO THE "SC PROCUREMENT REVIEW PANEL."

LEGAL REPRESENTATION: In order to prosecute an appeal before the Panel, business entities organized and registered as corporations, limited liability companies, and limited partnerships

must be represented by a lawyer. Failure to obtain counsel will result in dismissal of your appeal. *Protest of Lighting Services*, Case No. 2002-10 (Proc. Rev. Panel Nov. 6, 2002) and *Protest of The Kardon Corporation*, Case No. 2002-13 (Proc. Rev. Panel Jan. 31, 2003); and *Protest of PC&C Enterprises, LLC*, Case No. 2012-1 (Proc. Rev. Panel April 2, 2012). However, individuals and those operating as an individual doing business under a trade name may proceed without counsel, if desired.

Good afternoon. After several phone conversations and emails with Mr. Jonathan Eckstrom regarding Item 1 on the above referenced solicitation, we here at Thompson & Little, Inc. are formally protesting the Intent to Award this item to CE Holt.

Several reasons are behind this protest. 1- The model Southbend that Thompson & Little, Inc bid for item 1 exceeds the model bid by CE Holt, and at a lower cost. 2- The basis of the Intent to Award to CE Holt is a spark ignition, rather than a hot surface igniter. The purpose of this email is to clarify the Intent to Award for Items 1 and 3 on Solicitation 5400007557.

Item 1 of Solicitation 5400007557

SCDC specification for Item 1 on Solicitation 5400007557 states the following:

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Thompson Little, Inc., filed a protest against the Intent to Award on Line Item 1, June 2, 2014, stating: Several reasons are behind this protest. 1- The model Southbend that Thompson & Little, Inc bid for item 1 exceeds the model bid by CE Holt, and at a lower cost. 2- The basis of the Intent to Award to CE Holt is a spark ignition, rather than a hot surface igniter. We have written documentation from the VP of Sales of Southbend stating that the model bid by CE Holt has the exact same hot surface igniter as the model bid by Thompson & Little, Inc. We believe

that the manufacturer of the product is providing the correct information regarding the type of electronic ignition on these ovens. Therefore, it would not be in the best interest of the SC DOC to purchase an oven of lesser value at a higher cost, because the bidding dealer is saying that the oven has electronic spark ignition, when (see attached letter) it clearly does not.

Thompson Little Inc., submitted Southbend Convection Oven Model SL-Series (SLGS/22SC) a product they determined as an equal to the Hobart Convection Oven Model HGC502 for \$4,77.31 per oven (14) for a total price of \$66,882.34. Once all bids were tabulated and reviewed the descriptive literature submitted by Thompson Little, Inc., was sent to SCDC Division of Food Services and SCDC Facilities Management Division to determine if the equal submitted by Thompson Little, Inc., was indeed an equal to the Hobart Convection Oven Model HGC502 Natural set of 2 stacked with exhaust kit-110v-10 phase as stated in SCDC specifications. SCDC Division of Food Services and SCDC Facilities Management Division determined that the Southbend Convection Oven Model SL-Series (SLGS/22SC) was not an equal because the Southbend Convection Oven Model SL-Series (SLGS/22SC) has a hot surface igniter and not an electronic spark ignition as stated in SCDC specifications.

Once it was determined that Thompson Little's submittal did not meet SCDC specifications Jonathan Eckstrom, the Buyer overseeing this solicitation moved to the second low bidder. The next vendor was C.E. Holt. C.E. Holt submitted a Southbend B-Series Model: BGS/22SC. The descriptive literature submitted by C.E. Holt was sent to SCDC Division of Food Services and SCDC Facilities Management Division to determine if the equal submitted by C.E. Holt was indeed an equal to the Hobart Convection Oven Model HGC502 Natural set of 2 stacked with exhaust kit-110v-10 phase as stated in SCDC specifications. According to descriptive literature that was submitted by C.E. Holt the specifications stated electronic ignition. Jonathan Eckstrom the SCDC Buyer overseeing this solicitation emailed Melissa Turner with C.E. Holt for clarification that the electronic ignition as stated in their descriptive literature would have electronic spark igniter and not a hot surface igniter. Ms. Turner wrote back that Item 1 will be an electronic spark igniter. Therefore, based on the clarification that Mr. Eckstrom received from Ms. Turner, SCDC Division of Food Services and SCDC Facilities Management Division made the determination that the Southbend B-Series Model BGS/22SC met SCDC specification therefore, an Intent to Award was issued for line item 1.

Based on additional information received after the protest was filed from Brian Jurasek, VP of Sales-Southeast Southbend, the hot surface igniter ignition system is used in both the BGS and the SLGS convection ovens. This system uses a 24v, silicon carbide, hot surface igniter that lights the burner system for both series. Please do not confuse this with an electronic spark igniter which is a system that Southbend does not use on any of its convection ovens.

Based on the new information obtained from the Brian Jurasek, SCDC is making a motion to the Chief Procurement Officer of South Carolina to rescind the award that SCDC made to C.E Holt and allow SCDC to issue a New Amended Intent to Award for Line Item 1 to General Sales whose price was \$5,420.00 per oven (14) for a total price of \$75,880.00. General Sales bid as specified as stated in SCDC specifications: Hobart Convection Oven Model HGC502 Natural set of 2 stacked with exhaust kit-110v-10 phase.

Thompson Little, Inc., filed a protest against the Intent to Award on Line Item 3 on June 5, 2014 stating: I have reviewed the specs for the item and have also been told by both manufacturer's Cleveland and Southbend for which I bid the spec and an alternate, that manual hand tilt is what was requested. CE Holt bid a power tilt model. Both manufacturers' quoted me the hand tilt, because that was what was requested. It stated for the Cleveland model that electric tilt was standard, but in the specs below it requested the option of manual hand tilt, which is what I bid for both

Thompson Little Inc., submitted Southbend Gas Tilting Skillet with Manual Tilt Model: BGLM-40 a product they determined as an equal to the Tilting Skillet, Gas: Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 gallon -110V-10 phase for \$8,747.13 per tilt (12) for a total price of \$104,965.52. Once all bids were tabulated and reviewed the descriptive literature submitted by Thompson Little, Inc., was sent to SCDC Division of Food Services and SCDC Facilities Management Division to determine if the equal submitted by Thompson Little, Inc., was indeed an equal to the Tilting Skillet, Gas Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 gallon -110V-10 phase as stated in SCDC specifications. SCDC Division of Food Services and SCDC Facilities Management Division determined that the Southbend Gas Tilting Skillet with Manual Tilt Model: BGLM-40 does not have a power tilt as stated in SCDC specifications.


Once it was determined that Thompson Little's submittal did not meet SCDC specifications Jonathan Eckstrom, the Buyer overseeing this solicitation moved to the second low bidder. The next vendor was C.E. Holt. C.E. Holt submitted a Southbend Gas Tilting BGLTS Model 40. The descriptive literature submitted by C.E. Holt was sent to SCDC Division of Food Services and SCDC Facilities Management Division to determine if the equal submitted by C.E. Holt was indeed an equal to the Tilting Skillet, Gas: Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 gallon -110V-10 phase as stated in SCDC specifications. Therefore, based on the descriptive literature submitted SCDC Division of Food Services and SCDC Facilities Management Division made the determination that the Southbend BGLTS Model 40 met SCDC specification therefore, an Intent to Award was issued for Item 3.

Based on additional Information received after the protest was filed from Mark Schantz with Cleveland Range SCDC specifications are inadequate or ambiguous because Tilting Skillet, Gas: Cleveland Range Model SGL40TR 40 gallon -110V-10 phase is not available with both a manual tilt and a power tilt. Therefore, SCDC Division of Food Services must determine their need and resubmit a clear and accurate set of specifications to SCDC Procurement Department in order to rebid the item.

Therefore, based on the new information obtained from Mark Schantz at Cleveland Range SCDC is making a motion to the Chief Procurement Officer of South Carolina to rescind the award that SCDC made to C.E Holt for line item 3.
