# So, what's this "Special Standards of Responsibility" clause all about and when do I use it?

Special Standards of Responsibility - This clause falls under the State's Qualifications clauses but is optional as to whether you include it in your solicitation. So, then the questions would be: What is it? When do I use it? Why would I NOT use it?

### What Is It

Section V of a solicitation for the State is the area referencing Contractor Qualifications. This section establishes qualifications of offerors, information that is required to evaluate responsibility, and any special standards of responsibility that an offeror must possess to be considered responsible. Unless an Offeror possesses the noted mandatory minimum qualifications, they should not submit an offer. When you create mandatory minimum qualification requirements, you are establishing "Special Standards of Responsibility." Offerors who do not have the required qualifications <u>MUST</u> be deemed nonresponsible.



Offerors who don't have the required qualifications must be deemed *non-responsible*.

### When and How Do I Determine the Minimum Qualifications?

The Code has given us clear guidance on how the minimum qualifications list is determined. Regulation 19-445. 2125 (f) states;

"When it is necessary for a particular acquisition or class of acquisitions, the procurement officer may develop, with the assistance of appropriate specialists, special standards of responsibility. Special Standards may be particularly desirable when experience has demonstrated that unusual expertise or specialized facilities are needed for adequate contract performance. The special standards shall be set forth in the solicitation (and so identified) and shall apply to all offerors. A valid special standard of responsibility must be specific, objective and mandatory."

So, the minimum qualifications list does not come from our likes and dislikes, but from a bona fide list of requirements that are necessary for this contract to be successful and to help ensure adequate contract performance.

## Examples of a Special Standards of Responsibility

The following are examples of the QUALIFICATIONS – SPECIAL STANDARDS OF RESPONSIBILITY (MAR 2015) clause # 5010-2

Example 1. STC Check Point Products and Services:

This section establishes special standards of responsibility. UNLESS YOU POSSESS THE FOLLOWING MANDATORY MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS, DO NOT SUBMIT AN OFFER:

Offeror must be a Star 2 or higher certified partner of Check Point Software Technologies and have at least one (1) certified Check Point Engineer on staff for the duration of the contract.

<u>Note regarding this "Special Standard":</u> In this case we want to make sure the offeror has a standing and good relationship with the Manufacturer and has a track record of sales with the Manufacturer. Having a Check Point Engineer is necessary to be able to recommend the correct products and services for an Agency IT configuration.





Example 2. Orientation & Mobility Services for South Carolina Commission for the Blind (SCCB):

- (a) This section establishes special standards of responsibility. UNLESS YOU POSSESS THE FOLLOWING MANDATO-RY MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS, DO NOT SUBMIT AN OFFER:
  - Certification by the Academy for Certification of Vision Rehabilitation and Education Professionals (ACVREP), or National Orientation and Mobility Certification (NOMC) and one year of full-time experience teaching O&M skills to the blind and visually impaired for an entity that Vocational Rehabilitation recognizes, such as a rehabilitation center, Community Rehabilitation Provider, a Veterans Administration hospital, or an educational setting.
  - The Offeror and Offeror's subcontractors must not appear on the Child Abuse and Neglect Central Registry and their SLED background checks must show they have not been convicted of, or pled guilty to, or nolo contende-re to, a felony or a crime involving drugs or moral turpitude.

<u>Note regarding this "Special Standard":</u> In this case, the minimum qualifications ensure that the offeror can perform the special task of working with the blind and has the required skills and certifications to perform. Additionally, they will be in the presence of children and we want to make sure that the background check has certain stipulations.

The second part of clause # 5010-2 QUALIFICATIONS – SPECIAL STANDARDS OF RESPONSIBILITY addresses required information that is needed to conduct a proper evaluation of Special Standards:

(b) Provide a detailed, narrative statement with adequate information to establish that you meet all the requirements stated in subparagraph (a) above. Include all appropriate documentation. If you intend for us to consider the qualifications of your key personnel, predecessor business(es), or subcontractor(s), explain the relationship between you and such person or entity.

<u>Note regarding part (b) of the clause: If you receive an offer and it does not provide a detailed narrative statement of</u> <u>the information requested, it is considered a minor informality.</u> We can afford them the opportunity to provide the re-<u>quired information, before the intent to award date.</u> If information is not received prior to that, they will be deemed non-<u>responsible.</u>

### Why Would I Not Use It

Remember this is an optional clause and should not be used if it is not necessary. Why? I am glad that you asked... The imposition of special standards limits competition.

Section 11-35-2730 of the SC Consolidated Procurement Code states:

All specifications shall be drafted as so to assure cost effective procurement of the state's needs and shall not be unduly restrictive.

As a Procurement Manager and the State's representative, you need to be sure it is necessary before utilizing the special standards of responsibility clause. If it is done unnecessarily, it limits competition and can drive up the cost of the product or services being offered to the State. As State Agents, we are mindful of this and want to be good stewards of the State's funds. Always be prepared to defend why your minimum qualifications are necessary if you choose to use them.

**PLEASE NOTE:** State agencies are required to participate in the recovery audit program required by annual proviso (2021/2022 Proviso 117.85). Recovery audits apply only to payments made more than one hundred eighty days prior to the date the audit is initiated and cover at least three complete fiscal years. Not all state agencies are on the same three-year cycle, however, many state agencies completed a recovery audit in 2019 for fiscal years 2016 through 2018 (i.e., July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018). Therefore, those state agencies should be gearing up to engage a recovery audit firm to complete recovery audits for fiscal years 2019 through 2021 (i.e., July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2021) in 2022. Every state agency is responsible for maintaining their compliance with the proviso requirements so verify the date of your agency's last completed recovery audit and take action as appropriate.
