DIGEST

Protest of Notice of Prequalification on grounds that the Department of Administration (the Department) erred by considering a poor reference and failing to consider a bid bond in lieu of a letter from surety and insurer denied where the Department had a right to rely on the reference; and even if protestant had, based on the bid bond, been given the highest possible score for that criteria, protestant's ranking would not have changed.

AUTHORITY

Per S.C. Code Ann. § 11-35-4210, the Chief Procurement Officer for Construction (CPOC) conducted an administrative review of a protest filed by Climate Control Systems of Greenwood, Inc. (CCS) protesting the Department's decision not to prequalify CCS to submit a bid on a project to replace HVAC Units and light fixtures in Buildings B, C, and D at the Commission for the Blind (the Project). CCS's protest is attached as Exhibit A.¹ This decision is based on materials in the procurement file and applicable law and precedents.

¹ The CPOC has included CCS's Statement of Qualifications and bid bond in Exhibit A. These are two documents CCS referenced in its protest but did not include as attachments.

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BACKGROUND

The following are facts relevant to this protest:

- On February 1, 2023, the Department published an invitation for construction prequalification for the Project. On February 3, 2023, revised and published a new invitation. [Exhibit B]
- By the deadline for receipt of statements of qualifications and supporting documentation, the Department received five statements including a statement of qualification from CCS. [Exhibit C]
- On February 23, 2023, the Department evaluated the five statements of qualifications with accompanying documentation and ranked the five contractors from most qualified to least qualified. The Department ranked CCS number four out of the five contractors. [Exhibit D]
- On February 23, 2023, the Department posted a Notice of Prequalification of Contractors listing the three highest ranked offerors. [Exhibit E]
- On March 6, 2023, CCS protested the Department's decision not to include it in the list of contractors prequalified bid on the Project.

DISCUSSION

The Department conducted prequalification on the Project per S.C. Code Ann. §11-35-3023, which states:

In accordance with this section, the applicable section of Article 5, and procedures published by the State Engineer, a governmental body may limit participation in a solicitation for construction to only those businesses, including potential subcontractors, that are prequalified.

The applicable section of Article 5 states:

(a) Before soliciting bids, the procurement officer, may issue a request for qualifications from prospective bidders. The request must contain, at a minimum, a description of the scope of work to be solicited by the invitation for bids, the deadline for submission of information, and how prospective bidders may apply for consideration. The request must require information concerning the prospective bidders' product specifications, qualifications, experience, and ability to perform the requirements of the contract. Adequate public notice of the request for qualifications must be given in the manner provided in Section 11-35-1520(3).

(b) After receipt of the responses to the request for qualifications from prospective bidders, the rank of the prospective bidders **must be determined in writing from most qualified to least qualified** on the basis of the information provided. Bids then must be solicited from at least the top two prospective bidders by means of an invitation for bids.

The determination regarding how many bids to solicit is not subject to review under Article 17.²

S.C. Code Ann. §11-35-1520(11) [emphasis supplied]

An agency's ranking determination pursuant to the prequalification process is final unless "clearly erroneous, arbitrary, capricious, or contrary to law." S.C. Code Ann. §11-35-2410(A). As the protestant, CCS has the burden of proving upon a preponderance of the evidence that the Department's prequalification ranking is "clearly erroneous, arbitrary, capricious, or contrary to law." *In Re: Protest of Nalco Company*, Panel Case No. 2004-7.

In this case, the Department chose to select the three highest-ranked contractors to bid the project. CCS contacted the Department to find out why it was not chosen to submit a bid. According to CCS, the Department told CCS that it was "denied prequalification" for two (2) reasons:

(1) it failed to provide written statements from its insurance and bonding agent regarding its ability to provide insurance and bonding for the amounts required by the Project, and (2) it has a "harmful reference" on file.

Respecting the first issue, CCS argues that it supplied a bid bond that the Department should have considered. CCS correctly argues that a bid bond indicates that the surety will provide the principal with a performance and payment bond. In the usual course, a bid bond is provided with an actual bid in response to a request for bid. In this case, there is neither a request for bid nor a bid. The bid bond amount is a percentage of the bid amount, but there is no bid and no bid amount. Therefore, it is not clear to the CPOC that in this case, the supplied bid bond indicates an ability to obtain bonds for this Project. Even assuming it does, the bid bond does not address the requirement for a letter from CCS's insurance agent "indicating the Contractor's capability of providing the contract-required amount of insurance." Exhibit C, Part C(1).

Even if the Department gave credit to CCS for the bid bond, it would not change the result. The evaluation sheets show that each evaluator assigned CCS a score of zero out of a possible 10 points for the criteria "Financial Information Regarding the Ability to Provide Required Bonding and Insurance." As illustrated by the below tables, even if each evaluator had given CCS a perfect score of 10 for this factor, CCS would still be ranked four of five.

Respecting the "harmful reference," CCS first argues that the Department should have given CCS the "opportunity to address the claim [reference]" before considering it in the Department's evaluation. However, there is no such requirement in the Consolidate Procurement Code and CCS does allege a violation of any other state law.

CCS next speculates that the harmful reference came from Clemson University and derives from "a minor dispute related to work performed by CCS Builders and outstanding payments owed on a project in Kershaw County."³ CCS observes that CCS Builders is a separate company, though one with overlapping ownership with CCS. CCS argues that the Department should not have considered a negative reference for CCS Builders when evaluating CCS.

According to the information on file with the Contractor's Licensing Board, Jeff Scott is the President/Owner of both CCS and CCS Builders. [Exhibit F] Jeff Scott is the primary qualifying party for CCS's Heating, Air Conditioning, Electrical, and Plumbing Licenses.⁴ [Id.] Moreover, Jeff Scott is the primary qualifying party for CSS Builder's BD license. [Id.] Under the Contractor's Licensing Laws, a qualifying party is "an individual who has been issued a certificate to qualify an entity for a license." S.C. Code Ann. § 40-11-20(20). However, the primary qualifying party is not only "an individual who has been issued a certificate to qualify an entity for a license." S.C. Code Ann. § 40-11-20(20). However, the primary qualifying party is not only "an individual who has been issued a certificate to qualify an entity for a license." S.C. Code Ann. § 40-11-20(20). However, the primary qualifying party must be "an employee in a responsible for directing or reviewing work performed by the licensee." S.C. Code Ann. § 40-11-20(18). A primary qualifying party must be "an employee in a responsible management position." S.C. Code Ann. § 40-11-240(A)(6). As the President/Owner and primary qualifying party for both CCS and CCS Builders, Jeff Scott is necessarily intimately involved in the management and direction of the work of both companies. Therefore, a reference regarding one company is relevant to the other.

³ CCS Builders previously filed a contract controversy with the CPOC on this matter. Legal counsel for the parties are currently discussing the matter between themselves, and the CPOC has no opinion as to the merits of the matter.

⁴ The Contractor's Licensing Board documentation uses both Jeff Scott and Jeffery Scott. For purposes of this decision, the CPOC assumes Jeff Scott and Jeffery Scott are the same person. This assumption is supported by a listing of CCS's team found on its website. However, even if they are two different individuals, the results of this decision would be the same.

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The "Contractor's Statement of Qualifications & Questionnaire," which interested contractors were required to fill out and submit to the Department for consideration, recognizes that overlapping ownership can be relevant to an evaluation of qualifications. For this reason, Part IIIA(2) asks the following:

In the last five (5) years, has the organization, parent organization, any subsidiary business, or any business with which any of the organization's owners, officers, partners, or qualifying parties were associated, been debarred, disqualified, removed, or otherwise prevented from bidding on, completing, or contracting to perform any government agency or public works project for any reason? "Associated with" refers to another construction organization in which an owner, partner or officer of the organization held a similar position.

Accepting CSS's speculation of the source of the "harmful reference," and based on the foregoing, the CPOC finds it was not "clearly erroneous, arbitrary, capricious, or contrary to law" for the Department to consider a reference regarding the performance of CCS Builders in evaluating CCS.

DECISION

Based on the foregoing, the CPOC denies CCS's protest.

Protest Appeal Notice (Revised July 2022)

The South Carolina Procurement Code, in Section 11-35-4210, subsection 6, states:

(6) Finality of Decision. A decision pursuant to subsection (4) is final and conclusive, unless fraudulent or unless a person adversely affected by the decision requests a further administrative review by the Procurement Review Panel pursuant to Section 11-35-4410(1) within ten days of posting of the decision in accordance with subsection (5). The request for review must be directed to the appropriate chief procurement officer, who shall forward the request to the panel or to the Procurement Review Panel, and must be in writing, setting forth the reasons for disagreement with the decision of the appropriate chief procurement officer. The person also may request a hearing before the Procurement Review Panel. The appropriate chief procurement officer and an affected governmental body shall have the opportunity to participate fully in a later review or appeal, administrative or judicial.

FILING FEE: Pursuant to Proviso 111.1 of the 2022 General Appropriations Act, "[r]equests for administrative review before the South Carolina Procurement Review Panel shall be accompanied by a filing fee of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), payable to the SC Procurement Review Panel. The panel is authorized to charge the party requesting an administrative review under the South 11-35-4210(6), Carolina Sections 11-35-4220(5), Code 11-35-4230(6) and/or 11-35-4410...Withdrawal of an appeal will result in the filing fee being forfeited to the panel. If a party desiring to file an appeal is unable to pay the filing fee because of financial hardship, the party shall submit a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the same time the request for review is filed. [The Request for Filing Fee Waiver form is attached to this Decision.] If the filing fee is not waived, the party must pay the filing fee within fifteen days of the date of receipt of the order denying waiver of the filing fee. Requests for administrative review will not be accepted unless accompanied by the filing fee or a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the time of filing." PLEASE MAKE YOUR CHECK PAYABLE TO THE "SC PROCUREMENT REVIEW PANEL."

LEGAL REPRESENTATION: In order to prosecute an appeal before the Panel, business entities organized and registered as corporations, limited liability companies, and limited partnerships must be represented by a lawyer. Failure to obtain counsel will result in dismissal of your appeal. *Protest of Lighting Services*, Case No. 2002-10 (Proc. Rev. Panel Nov. 6, 2002) and *Protest of The Kardon Corporation*, Case No. 2002-13 (Proc. Rev. Panel Jan. 31, 2003); and *Protest of PC&C Enterprises, LLC*, Case No. 2012-1 (Proc. Rev. Panel April 2, 2012). However, individuals and those operating as an individual doing business under a trade name may proceed without counsel, if desired.

PROTEST BY CLIMATE CONTROL SYSTEMS

Dear Sir:

Pursuant to S.C. Code § 11-35-4210, please accept this letter as Climate Control Systems' formal protest of the Prequalification of Contractors for the above-referenced Project.

Climate Control Systems has standing to file this Protest as it is an aggrieved party with respect to the prequalification of contractors for the Project. Climate Control Systems timely submitted its "Contractor's Statement of Qualifications & Questionnaire" on February 21, 2023. (See Completed Statement attached as Exhibit A). On February 23, 2023, the Agency posted Form SE-170 Notice of Prequalification of Contractors, and Climate Control Systems was not listed as a prequalified contractor. Consequently, Climate Control Systems will not have an opportunity to bid Project No. D50-6054-FW-B.

Basis of Denial

Upon receiving notice that it was not a prequalified contractor for the Project, Climate Control Systems immediately contacted the Agency Project Coordinator, Alfredo Toral. Mr. Toral informed Climate Control Services that it was denied prequalification for two (2) reasons: (1) it failed to provide written statements from its insurance and bonding agent regarding its ability to provide insurance and bonding for the amounts required by the Project, and (2) it has a "harmful reference" on file. Though we understand that the Agency maintains discretion to deny prequalification, it is of note that the denial of Climate Control Systems' prequalification is not based on any of the reasons stated in Section C of the Contractor Questionnaire.

Additionally, as explained below, we believe the purported reasons for denial are unsupported, improper, arbitrary and capricious.

Climate Control Sytstems' Response

Insurance and Bonding Statement

Regarding the written statement of insurance and bonding, Climate Control Systems submitted the actual bid bond instead of a letter from our insurance provider. Although not in letter form, an actual bid bond is concrete evidence of our ability to provide the project owner the required assurances. Climate Control Systems has a long history of completing successful projects—of all sizes, values and complexities—for the State of South Carolina and its governmental agencies. Insurance and bonding has never been an issue for Climate Control Systems.

Harmful Reference

Regarding the "harmful reference," again, Climate Control Systems has performed and completed numerous successful projects for the State of South Carolina and the Department of Administration. After 30 years in business, I am not aware of any complaints or issues with our job performance. So, it is quite surprising to hear about an alleged "harmful reference." However, more concerning, is the Selection Committee's reliance on the harmful reference to exclude Climate Control Systems from bidding on the Project, without at least providing Climate Control Systems with an opportunity to address the claim.

Without knowing the source of the "harmful reference," we are only left to speculate as to what it could be. Of note, a separate entity, CCS Builders, which has some overlapping ownership with Climate Control Systems, is currently involved in negotiations with Clemson University (John McEntire is the "Owner's Senior Representative - Director of Capital Projects) over a minor dispute related to work performed by CCS Builders and outstanding payments owed on a project in Kershaw County. Legal counsel for CCS Builders and Clemson University are actively discussing the merits of the claims and the potential for a resolution of all issues. This is an isolated (first and only time) issue for CCS Builders. Moreover, CCS Builders is a separate and distinct corporate entity from Climate Control Systems. Climate Control Systems' reputation and standing should not be negatively impacted by the alleged failures of CCS Builders.

If the CCS Builders' dispute is the origin of the alleged harmful reference, we submit that the Selection Committee's reliance on a negative reference, from a project involving a completely separate and distinct entity, to exclude Climate Control Systems is wholly improper and arbitrary and capricious.

Conclusion

As stated, Climate Control Systems maintains a great reputation in the industry and has successfully performed and completed numerous projects for the State of South Carolina and, in particular, the SC Department of Administration. Further, all qualifications of the questionnaire have been met.

Climate Control Systems has a longstanding track record of being a recognized, responsible and competitive bidder. Climate Control Systems has successfully completed all State and other projects on time (zero

instances of LD's) without complaint. The decision by the Selection Committee appears to lack merit or a sound basis. In other words, we submit that such decision was arbitrary and capricious.

Also, we feel the decision to exclude us from this bid is a possible disservice to the responsible stewardship of the State's funds and to the taxpayers of the State of South Carolina, as Climate Control Systems may provide the most cost efficient bid and best project management for the Project.

As such, Climate Control Systems respectfully requests that it be instated as a qualified bidder for Project No. D50-6054-FW-B.
